January is a great time to start Emergency Communications Courses

As Dave, N2FEP has explained in the past, in order for our group to be activated by any governmental agency, we must be able to provide operators who are trained in FEMA Incident Command System (ICS) procedures. We must have completed the required FEMA courses and received certification. That way, when we report for communications duty in an emergency, we know what to expect, and we can interact seamlessly with other agencies.

There are four FEMA courses (also called NIMS courses) that constitute the basic ICS requirement: Courses #IS-100a, IS-200a, IS-700a, and IS-800b.

They are online courses that can be taken at your convenience, on your computer. Time required for each course is estimated at 3 hours, but we can all beat that, right? At the end, you must take a final exam to receive certification.

What better time than cold, dark January to refresh your emergency communications skills? If a few dozen members complete this series, we'll be ready for any emergency. Let's get started today.

And don't forget your Go-Kit for emergency communications. A typical kit would include at least one 2-meter HT (and manual), extra batteries, speaker mike, a ground-plane (or gain) antenna, wall charger, car charger, repeater directory, assorted connectors/adapters, message pads, pens/pencils, flashlights, VOM or multimeter, basic tools, electrical and duct tape, rope, bottled water, non-perishable food, first-aid kit, area maps, compass, gloves, hat, extra socks and underwear, insect repellent and TP. (Do you know what TP is?)

The next level would include a low-power HF transceiver, wire antenna and tuner, more batteries. Don't forget the Honda generator!

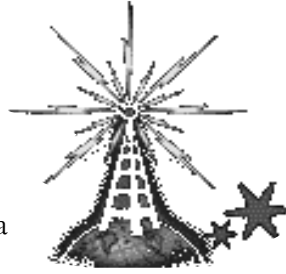




K2DLL ON THE INTERNET

The club operates two 2-meter repeaters. The 147.24 repeater is located 15 miles west of Saratoga Springs at Lake Nancy. This repeater has a members-only phone patch. The 147.00 repeater is located 10 miles north of Saratoga Springs on Spruce Mountain, near Corinth, NY. This repeater offers an "emergency" phone patch. These two machines, in combination, offer excellent North to South and East to West communications far beyond Saratoga County. These repeaters are now linked together full-time by the club's third repeater on 448.225 MHz.
